 - And more, including non-residential topics



Municipal ZNE Assistance

 Technical Assistance: No-cost engineering analysis to help local governments explore what it would take for municipal buildings to become ZNE, or to demonstrate ZNE policy feasibility for municipal building portfolios.



 Municipal ZNE RFP and OPR Template Language: Request for proposal (RFP) and owner project requirements (OPR) template language for local governments to encourage developers to construct new municipal buildings to ZNE.

A free, user-friendly online tool that provides information and building permit forms for three of the most common types of home projects:

- Replacing a hot water heater
- Replacing all or part of a roof
- Replacing or adding new windows
